Let no one be provoked to anger by you, or be scandalized, but rather may they be drawn to peace and good will, to benignity and concord through your gentleness. We have been called to heal wounds, to unite what has fallen apart, and to bring home those who have lost their way."

Testimony given by those who knew Angela personally mentions again and again her unique gift for bringing peace and reconciliation.

Antonio Romano, a friend in whose home Angela lived for a while, and who accompanied her on several of her pilgrimages, recounted: "This I know, that her holiness grew from day to day, and the renown of her spiritual life spread among the people, so that many from the city of Brescia came to her, whether to implore some grace from God through her very devout prayers, or to ask her to reconcile some dispute that had arisen among the citizens and other nobles of the town."

Agostino Gallo, a close friend and confidant of Angela, with whose family she lived, shared that for her, "...no opportunity was ever lost of making peace."

And Matteo Bellintani, a Franciscan biographer, said, "In the needs of her neighbor, and especially in cases of reconciliation, she showed admirable strength, succeeding in making peace where princes had failed to establish it."

Peacemaking...Loving Relationships

"With Jesus [and Angela], we have been called to be bridges. We have been called to be healers and peacemakers...Peacemaking does not begin in big meetings or street marches, but in welcoming with compassion others with whom we live and work. Peacemaking begins at home as we carry the wounds of others, and allow them to carry ours, in compassion, uplifting them, and nourishing their gifts...

In this way, a family or a community is built up, not founded on laws, administration, or good organization – necessary and important as these may be – but gently developed through loving relationships. This is the vocation of us all: to live real and loving relationships, to be peacemakers, creating and recreating the body of community." (Jean Vanier)
