ur meetings began on the feast of our saint, Marie of the Incarnation. As we held in prayer the needs of the province, the Church and the world we were very aware of Marie's strong quest to go in spirit "to every part of the earth" to share the Good News of God's unconditional love for all creation.

Our team meetings followed three full days of other gatherings—province healthcare delegates and health navigators, prioresses, and a retreat day together with both groups. Look for photos of these gatherings in this issue. We hope you'll be able to sense the enthusiasm, commitment and spirit of *insieme* that was so alive during all three days.

We had a full agenda of province business—personnel issues, appointments for sisters and also new trustees for three of the academies. We accepted a bequest from the estate of a friend of Villa Maria in Frontenac and allocated alms to the Institute for Peace and Justice in St. Louis. Time was also devoted to upcoming meetings beyond the province—the RULUSA and North American Ursuline Leadership Conference, both in May, and the national assembly of the

Leadership Conference of Women Religious which will take place in St. Louis in August.

Earlier in April we took a look at ways we can work toward greater sustainability at the province office. To mark the 48th annual Earth Day we began our first initiative—the elimination of paper and plastic products. We're investing in plates, bowls and flatware for daily use and larger events. Our hope is that this first small step will be just the beginning of a broader option for Earth and all creation.


We also want to share that, in the name of the Roman Union Ursulines of the Central Province, we signed on to the U.S. Catholic Climate Declaration. The Declaration is an expression of solidarity with the We Are Still In campaign which began in June 2017 after President Trump announced that he planned to withdraw the U.S. from the 2015 Paris Climate Agreement. The Declaration, with it's signatories, will be made public on June 11th—the third anniversary of the release of *Laudato Si*. You may be interested in reading Martha Counihan's book, *Jetta's Story*. Jetta was a Jewish teen who, with her family, risked death fleeing Zagreb, Yugoslavia. The family sought help from the Vatican and they were taken in at the Generalate.

Martha relates stories found in the diaries of two Ursuline nuns who lived in our Generalate during WWII. Their diaries record what it was like for Jetta and her family living under German occupation, facing deportation and death themselves for the crime of answering the call of their faith.

Update on the Ursuline Education Foundation

There have been two meetings of the Ursuline Education Foundation this past year, one in New Orleans, LA and most recently in Dallas, TX. We continue to be in a planning process for the sponsorship of our schools as we move forward. Several options for governance structure are being considered at this time and they are: ecclesiastical Decree of Formal Consent from the diocesan bishop as an independent Catholic school, Public Juridic Person and finally a civil corporation or holding company. No final decision has been made at this time and we ask for continued prayers. We are very grateful to the men and women who serve on the Foundation Board giving of their time and sharing their wisdom.



Social Justice Notes

The House of Representatives is considering legislation (H.R.2 — Agriculture and Nutrition Act of 2018 — the Farm Bill) which would significantly limit access to food stamps (the SNAP program).
