Something to Share

Five of us from the St. Louis area participated in the recent LCWR Region X day for women religious in our area. The presenter, Sr. Teresa Maya, CCVI is the current President of LCWR. She spoke on the topic: *What is our call as women religious as we face the growing diversity in the U.S.?* Over the course of the day, she used 4 lenses to focus our reflection:

- 1. Answering the Call: What needs examination?
- 2. Religious Life: What can we offer?
- 3. What does the LCWR Call to Action require?
- 4. Bringing It Home: What can we do in our local context?

Using the Pew Research Study on <u>The Next America</u> she called our attention to the Big Picture of diversity in our country & changing demographics, and contrasted this with questions regarding the pace of Church and religious life to respond to this reality. She suggested that the Catholic Church in the U.S. has the possibility of becoming the first "world Church" with Mass celebrated in 85 different languages on any given Sunday. Teresa gave us lots to reflect on and challenged us to be aware that while we can't do everything, we can, and must, do something. Sound familiar? "Do something, get moving . . ."
