

## Ursuline Education Foundation Canonical Stewards Meeting December 1, 2023

Present for the Zoom call meeting were Sr. Ann Barrett, Sr. Mary Ann Dooling, John Grimes, Margaret Hesse, James MacLaren, Karen Mortillaro, Regina Sullivan and Erin Valentine. Sr. Peggy Moore could not be present. Win Bell resigned from the Stewards Council so was not present.

John opened the meeting by thanking everyone for their continued commitment to the Ursuline Education Foundation. Karen Mortillaro then offered the opening prayer.

The purpose of today's meeting was stated: to review the financial topics that are the responsibility of the Canonical Stewards as it oversees the finances of the UEF. Specifically budgeting, financial planning, financial reporting, audit and compliance, and fundraising guidance. Also to develop, review and evaluate financial parameters of candidate schools applying for inclusion in the UEF. A short discussion took place regarding the importance of a school's financial stability as a requirement for admission to the UEF as well as the Mission component.

John presented a 2 page *UEF funding analysis* document (attached) forecasting a draft of UEF/MI expenses and school contributions to fund the UEF and MI offices through 2027-28. For the 2023-24 school year the schools are contributing \$70,000. For 2024-25 the amount the schools will be asked to give is expected to be \$120,000, a 3% increase. By 2027-28; with a 3% increase each year, the expectation is the

schools will be asked to give \$160,701 to fully fund the UEF and MI offices.

The draft *UEF funding analysis* also shows the contribution amount each school is expected to give over the years through 2027-28 when they are to totally support the UEF and MI offices. Previous discussion with the heads of schools determined that some of our schools cannot afford to pay the amounts that would be their fair share of the total contribution. UA Dallas and UA Dedham have indicated they can continue to pay their fair share but at this time UA Kirkwood, UA New Orleans and Mount Merici are not able to increase their contributions. (It is assumed that they will be able to continue to pay the amounts they are presently paying.) Therefore, there is a gap between what the schools are asked to pay and what the schools can pay. Discussion followed on the need to find ways to fund this gap, perhaps an endowment fund, grants, investments etc. It was noted the Finance Committee will have some very significant issues to deal with.

The next meeting of the stewards will be January 19, at 10:00 am central time, 11:00 am in the east. This will be a meeting of the Canonical Council so the heads of schools will also be present. Oficers will be appointed, and terms will be renewed as necessary. This meeting will also provide the heads and stewards the opportunity to begin talking about the March 26<sup>th</sup> meeting in Dallas.

Also planned for the January 19<sup>th</sup> meeting is the voting for three new stewards for the Canonical Council. One candidate is a person from Dallas who would replace Win Bell. Another candidate is a person from New Orleans and, hopefully, we will have a third candidate from the Dedham area.

There were several announcements: Andi Shurley will be the new president at Ursuline Dallas. Ursuline New Orleans is in the process of

selecting a new president as Karen Jakuback is moving to Houston and Stacy Shoulta has replaced Tina St. Pierre as head of school at Mount Merici Academy.

A reminder of the March 26 meeting in Dallas was given and that the form for hotel reservations will be sent after the new year.


There being no further business the meeting was adjourned.


