During my twenty-two years working with the Ursulines, most recently as the eastern province Director of Health Services, I have felt that I became part of a large extended family. As with any family, you feel a gamut of emotions: happiness, sadness, frustration, and even anger at times, but you always feel love. Even during trying times you never walk away. I have often told people that my job is more than just a job. You take your worries home with you just as you would with your immediate family. No two individuals are the same, and everyone gifts you with something unique. Developing and maintaining relationships is an ongoing process; yet these relationships enrich my life. Just as St. Angela could relate to people both within and outside her community, I too find myself connecting with our sisters, our fellow employees, and our sisters' family members as well. As Religious Education Director for my local church, I began working with the western province's Srs. Mary Dostal and Pat Funderhide as co-facilitator for our collaborative Vacation Bible School program in 2005. My parish represents a large Hispanic community, and the sisters facilitated the Kateri Indian Ministries, which was led by and for Native Americans. In 2006, the sisters invited me onto the board of directors for their organization, *Angela's Piazza*, a women's drop-in center in Billings, MT. I had served on the board for four years when they invited me on as staff, and I now serve as director. I have always felt spiritually aligned with the mission and ministry of *Angela's Piazza*, including making your heart and home like a piazza, where everyone is welcome.

In my years at *Angela's Piazza*, I have grown to learn and more deeply understand the charism and teachings of St. Angela. Through our programs for marginalized women, and in our community gatherings, St. Angela's words are front and center: "May your words be compassionate leading to concord and charity."
